"Our players are honored to bring joy to kids and families facing so much."

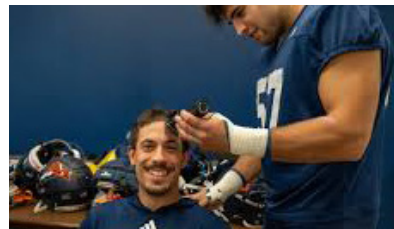


BISON TEAMS UNITE
